Following the close presidential election in 2000, journalists and media researchers discussed the media impact on the perception of candidates and posed the question whether "democracy will survive the media?" Through an analysis of referenda in Switzerland and other elections worldwide, the impact of the media on voter perceptions is found in many instances to correlate with outcomes. Thus a better question might be "Can elections still be called a vote — or are they nothing else but just a reaction to what people perceive in their media?" The presentation will present recent research on subject, and explore whether democracy is enhanced or diminished through today's media.

Mr Roland Schatz is the founder and CEO of Media Tenor International, the world's leading provider of ongoing global media content analysis.
